




Sarah Dobson



Finances (Cont'd)


- A substantial part of LPC reserves earmarked for traffic calming (£5,000)
- LPC do get Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) money from new developments which are sold at Market Value. This is intended for projects around the Parish which help the Parish cope with the additional requirements the new housing brings. Further CIL is anticipated this year of approximately £20,000 from the Woolspinners project.



The Last Year

A Loxwood Heritage Trail pointing out heritage sites and points of interest funded by the Council is now up and running and more on that later.
The North Hall PV Panels have been a great addition to North Hall saving fossil fuel energy consumption significantly
The Final Draft of the Traffic Calming Measures proposal is now with WSCC for comments after which it will be consulted upon with the residents.
The LSA renovations are well underway with better facilities for changing to allow women's team changing rooms but more on that later.
Fortunately the Loxwood Clay Pits appeal did not go ahead but the Parish Council and Stop The Claypits Group were ready with professionals to fight the appeal.


